Guest Speaker: Col William Darby, Commander, Fox Army Health Center (FAHC), Redstone Arsenal

Colonel Darby enlisted in the United States Army in 1984 received a direct commission in 1988 as an Environmental Science Officer. He has served in a variety of assignments, including US Special Ops Command, US Central Forces Command, and as an adjunct Professor at the United States Army Medical Department Center and School. During his career he has been deployed numerous times, including his duties as Joint Task Force Surgeon in support of Hurricanes GUSTAV and IKE.

Before arriving in Huntsville and assuming command of as the Fox Amy Health Center, Colonel Darby was was most recently assigned as the Chief, Concepts and Requirements Division, Directorate of Combat and Doctrine Development, Fort Sam Houston, TX.

Col Darby provided inspirational words for the soon-to-be 2LT's in attendance, focusing on their transitions from students to leaders, along with the responsibility and opportunities that transition means for them.

Col Darby also discussed a White Paper, "Innovative Solutions will Reduce DOD Health Care Costs" by CAPT Kathryn Beasley, USN-Ret, which can be found on the MOAA website: (http://www.moaa.org/uploadedFiles/MOAA Main/Main Menu/Take Action/Top Issues/Innovative%20Solutions.pdf.) He highlighted key aspects of the paper and the ways FAHC is implementing some of the solutions.

Col Darby closed by pointing out the impact of sequestration on FAHC, especially in terms of potential furlough of the staff which is 96% civilian, which would cause the center to be closed every Friday during the furlough period.
