"All politics is local." As I mentioned last month, be prepared to begin the next election cycle—the primary is set for 5 June 2018. The runoff is scheduled for 17 July, and the general election is set or 6 November 2018. You will be making a lot of choices. We will be electing someone to the US House of Representatives, as well as the governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, state auditor, secretary of state, state treasurer, Madison County Sheriff, a person for Alabama State Senator, and for the Alabama House of Representatives. And that is not the complete list. One will need a road map come Election Day.

Please take time to look at <u>http://takeaction.moaa.org</u>. These are some of the key bills MOAA thinks are important to you. Let your representatives in DC know what you think of them. This is a link to a webpage that allows you to prepare e-mails or print out letters your representatives.

- **S 143**. A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow a credit against income tax for amounts paid by a spouse of a member of the Armed Forces for a new State license or certification required by reason of a permanent change in the duty station of such member to another State.
- **HR 1384**. A bill to amend titles 5, 10, 37, and 38 of the United States Code to ensure that an order to serve on active duty under section 12304a and 12304b of title 10, United States Code, is treated the same as other orders to serve on active duty for determining the eligibility of members of the uniformed services and veterans for certain benefits and for calculating the deadlines for certain benefits.
- **HR 92**. A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to increase the maximum age for children eligible for medical care under the CHAMPVA program.
- **HR 93**. A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to provide for increased access to Department of Veterans Affairs medical care for women veterans.
- **HR 102.** A bill to expand the research and education on and delivery of complementary and alternative medicine to veterans, and for other purposes.

Fox Army Health Center 2018 Red Cross Volunteer Appreciation Day

Fox Army Health Center leaders know that a little help can go a long way when everyone is united for one common goal.

Fox staff paused January 8th for their annual observance of American Red Cross Volunteer Appreciation Day, a time to recognize the more than 30 individuals – and one therapy dog – who help make the medical treatment facility a success day in and day out.

"When I say it can't happen without you guys, those are not empty words, that is a very true reality. Thank you all. You guys are truly the backbone of the difference between good and great. Thank you so much," said Fox Commander COL Michael Oshiki, who presented each volunteer with a certificate of appreciation.

Over the course of 2017 volunteers gave 5,171.75 hours in service to Fox beneficiaries through a variety of roles, whether it be working in the pharmacy or providing information at the front desk. The Red Cross volunteers are an important part of why our wait times in the pharmacy have decreased from an average of one hour and 40 minutes in summer 2016 to under 10 minutes today, in a large part because of their sole support of the refill window.

"Without Red Cross folks that wouldn't happen – there's absolutely no way," Oshiki said. Volunteer Shirley Walker had the most service hours for 2017 with 478.5, while Yvonne Quantock continued her legacy as the longest serving volunteer with 47 years of service. When she began volunteering in pediatrics in 1970 Fox was still a hospital.

"I like the people," said Quantock, who typically volunteers on Fridays. "I'm now working in the pharmacy – I've been in the pharmacy for about 20 years – and I just enjoy it. It's fun. I enjoy the work."

Peggy Mann, Service to Armed Forces specialist for the American Red Cross, who coordinates the volunteers for Fox, echoed Oshiki's appreciation.

"I really, really appreciate all of the dedication and your help," Mann said. "You allow the staff here to be able to do what they need to do but doing what you do in supporting and loving on our active duty and veteran military population."

Surviving Spouse Corner: A Year in Review

The Surviving Spouse Advisory Committee (SSAC) began 2017 with the exciting opportunity to develop the second MOAA Virtual Chapter — following in the successful footsteps of the <u>Uniformed Services Nurse</u> <u>Advocates Virtual Chapter</u>. We completed the necessary paperwork in August and forwarded it to MOAA to be submitted to the board of directors for their approval at their February meeting.

In April, SSAC members participated in MOAA's annual Storming the Hill event in Washington, D.C., during which we asked legislators to prevent disproportional TRICARE fee hikes, end harmful sequestration cuts, and eliminate the Survivor Benefit Plan/Dependency and Indemnity Compensation offset affecting 63,000 surviving military spouses or extend and increase the Special Survivor Indemnity Allowance (SSIA) if the offset cannot be eliminated. We received positive feedback, and Congress included a provision in the FY 2018 National Defense Authorization Act that provides a permanent extension to the SSIA. We will continue to push Congress to eliminate the offset in its entirety.

We continued efforts to increase our visibility within the MOAA membership, including presentations about the SSAC at the Regional Leaders Workshop in Memphis in September and in Oklahoma City in November and the column "Your Secret Weapon" by Col. Terri Coles, USA (Ret), on page 48 of the November issue of *Military Officer* about the important roles of spouses and surviving spouses in local chapters.

Finally, in December, the SSAC named Shirley Phillips, of the Tucson (Ariz.) Chapter, its 2017 Surviving Spouse Liaison Excellence Award winner.

It has been a busy and exciting year with many new and challenging opportunities for the SSAC. We look forward to 2018 with the addition of new committee members, including a new virtual position aimed at younger surviving spouses who might not be able to travel because of jobs, children, etcetera, but who are interested in working on surviving spouse issues. Applications will be on the MOAA website in January 2018, and the two-year term begins April 2018.

SSAC member applications will be available in March 2018 on the MOAA website. Deadline for submission is June 30, and the four-year term, with an optional two-years, begins October 2018.

Chile is one of the astronomy capitals of the world, boasting three big-time observatories, including the Cerro Tololo observatory with its five telescopes.

Chile is the mecca of astronomers for several reasons. The sky is clear 85 percent of the time. The Cerro Tololo observatory is built 7,200 feet above sea level in the Andean foothills, where there is less air to distort a telescope's view. The region has a natural inversion layer that keeps the air at high altitude stable and the view better. Northern Chile is also directly under the Milky Way, so astronomers can peer into our galaxy for up to eight hours a night, in contrast to five hours at observatories in Hawaii which is the astronomy capital of the northern hemisphere.

Certain places on earth offer a clearer view of the heavens, and certain disciplines offer a clearer view of the heavens, and certain spiritual disciplines offer a clearer view of the spiritual things. Throughout the history of the church, believers have found that activities such as Bible memorization and meditation, fasting and prayer, solitude and study, celebration and worship, guidance and confession have helped them better see God and His truth.

Christmas gift wrapping at the PX

TRICARE Prime Users No Longer Need Referrals for Urgent Care

TRICARE Prime enrollees will now have an easier time accessing urgent medical care.

As of 1 January, most TRICARE Prime users won't need referrals for urgent-care visits - something that was previously required after the first two urgent-care visits each year. Point-of-service charges also will no longer apply for urgent-care claims, the Defense Health Agency announced.

Active duty servicemembers should still use military hospitals and clinics for their medical care. Those enrolled in TRICARE Prime Remote who don't live near a military hospital or clinic, however, won't need a referral when seeking urgent care.

Those on <u>TRICARE Select</u> or any other TRICARE plan can visit any authorized provider - in- or out-ofnetwork - for urgent care.

<u>Urgent care</u> is for non-emergency illnesses or injuries requiring treatment within 24 hours. Examples, according to the DHA, include a sprain, a rising temperature, or a sore throat.

If you're not sure whether to seek urgent care, you can call the 24/7 <u>Nurse Advice Line</u> at (800) TRICARE (874-2273)-Option 1, according to the release. A registered nurse can answer questions, give advice, and assist with finding a provider or scheduling an appointment.

Urgent care can serve as a good option if you're traveling or your primary doctor is unavailable. TRICARE users can find a nearby facility by using the <u>provider-search tool</u>.

Any TRICARE Overseas Prime users in need of care while on temporary duty or leave status in the U.S. may access urgent care without a referral or an authorization. Active duty troops must follow up with their primary-care manager, though, per DoD and service-specific regulations.

Guest Speaker: Billy McDonald, author and man of many talents

Billy McDonald graduated from Auburn University and was 2nd team all-SEC in Golf. He has been a banker, stock broker, golf instructor/fitter and Chairman of the Board of a multinational company. He retired and immediately had a heart attack! While recuperating he ran across a photo of his father in an airplane that he had never seen. Since he had time on his hands, he investigated and found 30,000 letters, documents and photos almost in ruin in his sister's basement. He found out quickly that there was a lot he did not know about his father, Mac. Six years later, Mac's story is now a book - The Shadow Tiger: Billy McDonald, Wingman to Chennault. That was not the end of his adventure. He, his wife, Nancy, and daughter, Maggie, went to China in 2016 to present the book and a replica of his father's commanding wings to 8 museums in China where he saw life size pictures of Mac in the museums. It was humbling to share with China history that they did not know. Mac's letters changed that, and the Chinese were very grateful. In 2017, The Smithsonian saw the book and asked Billy for his father's papers; they are now at the Smithsonian being digitized and will be available on the internet. What an honor for a son to preserve his father's legacy. After 4 years of hard work, Billy was able to get his father posthumously awarded the DFC and the Air Medal on August 24, 2018 – Maxwell AFB did a great job on presenting the medals!

Now he and Nancy travel around the country speaking to groups encouraging them to find the heroes in their families and to preserve their legacy for future generations (and selling books). They do find time to play golf and enjoy their grandchildren.
